



Attachment: Gangs and Offending behaviour

This workshop will look at the relationships between attachment, gangs, violence and offending behaviour.

Have you ever wondered why young people behave the way they do and why some engage in violent and criminal behaviour? Or are there elements beneath the surface that are really 'running the show' in their lives, elements which are not being explored?

This workshop will utilise John Bowlby's Attachment Theory to help us shed light and understanding on how early attachment bonds and relationships may be the influencing factor. Understanding attachment theory and attachment bonds can help bring some clarity to what is currently happening in our society, especially with regards youth violence and youth disengagement.

Take away a clearer understanding of how attachment influences gang culture, offending behaviour and rebellion; but also how things can change and the importance of rebuilding family bonds.
